On Florida's west coast, Clearwater's Harbor Oaks neighborhood became one of the noted residential havens for several industrialists, celebrities and professionals during the Florida land boom of the 1920s, as well as during the Great Depression and post–World War II eras.



About the Authors of Clearwater's Harbor Oaks



Tom Adamich is a Digital Asset Librarian (since 2011), certified teacher-librarian (since 2000) and a librarian since 1991. Tom is a graduate of the Kent State University (Ohio) School of Library/Information Science and KSU College of Education School Library Media Certification. He is president of the Visiting Librarian Service, a contract librarian firm he has operated on a full or part-time basis since 1993.

Tom grew up in Seminole, Florida, and later served as Cataloging Librarian for the Stetson University College of Law in Gulfport, Florida. He is also archivist, and historian – specializing in vehicle and Florida history-related topics.

Tom recently completed a multi-year project documenting the corporate archives of the Wills Sainte Claire Motorcar Company – the firm founded by C. Harold Wills in Marysville, Michigan in 1920. Wills was Henry Ford's Chief Engineer from 1903-1919 and responsible for many of Ford's early engineering successes. Wills also designed the famous Ford script logo still used today.

Gary H. Dworkin, MD was born in Cleveland, Ohio, and is a board-certified cardiovascular and thoracic surgeon who received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Northwestern University in 1979 in the combined 4 year B.A./M.S. Honors Program . He was awarded a medical degree from the Medical College of Ohio with Alpha Omega Alpha honors in 1983. His internship, general surgery residency, as well as his thoracic and cardiovascular surgery fellowship were all earned at the Medical College of Virginia.

Upon leaving Virginia, Dr. Dworkin became a Clinical Associate in the Division of Cardiothoracic Surgery at the Cleveland Clinic, Cleveland Ohio. In 1992, Dr. Dworkin joined Cardiac Surgical Associates in the Tampa Bay area. In the subsequent 18 years, Cardiac Surgical Associates became one of the largest private practice cardiovascular and thoracic surgical groups in the United States



Dr. Dworkin has owned the Studebaker Estate in Harbor Oaks since 1992 and has made a number of additions and renovations to it.

Dr. Dworkin is a Diplomat of the American Board of Thoracic Surgery. He is also a member, the Society of Thoracic Surgeons, Past-President of the Florida Society of Thoracic and Cardiovascular Surgeons, and President of the Cleveland Clinic Alumni Association. He has practiced cardiovascular and thoracic surgery for over 18 years, but today, Dr. Dworkin dedicates his medical career to the treatment of venous disease.

Over the years, Dr. Dworkin has observed, taught, and performed cardiovascular surgery in Europe, Canada, China, and Latin America. He has led five large medical missions to the Dominican Republic, providing sophisticated cardiovascular surgical care to the disadvantaged. Dr. Dworkin also speaks Spanish.
